

## Dathan ann an Ainmean-àite

<b>Dubh</b>	<i>black, dark (+ intensifier)</i>
<b>Dorch(a)</b>	<i>dark – rare in place names</i>
<b>Geal</b>	<i>white, bright, brilliant</i>
<b>Bàn</b>	<i>fair, off-white + empty, waste</i>
<b>Fionn</b>	<i>fair, white</i>
<b>Glas</b>	<i>dull grey, ashen, pale green (historically green cf Ireland)</i>
<b>Liath</b>	<i>silver-grey, grey-blue, light blue</i>
<b>Gorm</b>	<i>blue (darker than liath), emerald green</i>
<b>Uaine</b>	<i>green, yellow-green</i>
<b>Donn</b>	<i>brown (darker than odhar)</i>
<b>Odhar</b>	<i>dun, yellow-brown, colour of porridge</i>
<b>Buidhe</b>	<i>yellow (includes modern orains), usually refers to grasses</i>
<b>Dearg</b>	<i>red of blood, between pink and purple (+ intensifier)</i>
<b>Ruadh</b>	<i>red of hair, from deep yellow to russet</i>
<b>Airgead</b>	<i>silver</i>
<b>Òr</b>	<i>gold (usually in landscape as noun)</i>
<b>Breac</b>	<i>speckled, dappled</i>
<b>Riabhach</b>	<i>brindled, streaked</i>
